

Consonants X and Y



The name of this letter is x. X is a consonant. When x begins a word, it has the sound of z, so we will learn its ending sound first. At the end of a word, x says /ks/.

Write each slide with the slide arrow. Read each slide, and then write each word one time. Mark an x under the vowel. Then read the word.








The name of this letter is y. Y is a
